

THE SEDER SUPPER at Holy Faith

Holy Faith Parish is happy to celebrate this year the *Jewish Passover: Seder Supper* on **Thursday, April 11**, in *Parish Life Center*.

The *Seder* (from the Hebrew word for "order") is the festal meal eaten on one of the two nights of Passover, the Jewish celebration of the exodus from Egypt. We celebrate this Seder, with genuine respect for the Jewish tradition and Jewish covenant, recognizing that we are not Jewish, but we share with the Jews a story and an experience: once we were bound in slavery, but the Lord brought us to freedom, to covenant, to a Promised Land.

The *Seder Supper* is a ritual meal (not a party). The food and wine are consumed in set order. Because the ritual leading up to the meal takes quite some time, food will not be eaten until about one hour to an hour and a half from when the *Seder* begins. Children play a vital role in the ritual and are encouraged to attend. Nursery will also be available for those children for younger children or children with less endurance.

This experience will enrich our journey through **HOLY WEEK**, which begins **Palm Sunday**, April 9. We are looking forward to an enjoyable evening, rich in tradition and fellowship.
